

Visit to South Sulawesi

Yoga for Women



Electronic Customs Declaration (E-CD) at Indonesia's International Airports




Since 1 November 2022, international travelers can make electronic customs declarations online via https://ecd.beacukai.go.id. Such declarations can be made in advance, at least 2 days before departure.

Travelers entering Indonesia through Soekarno Hatta and I Gusti Ngurah Rai International Airport must fill in data via the page. After filling in the data, international travelers will get a bar code that needs to be shown to the customs officer.

The Indonesian authorities will implement electronic customs declarations at other international airports in stages.

NEWS FROM INDIA

Operation Dost

Following the massive earthquake that struck Türkiye and Syria on 6 February 2023, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi had directed that all possible assistance be extended to the affected people.

In pursuance of this, Operation Dost was launched to provide necessary support in terms SAR efforts as well as medical assistance. This has involved a wholeof-government approach with coordination among various agencies. This swift response led to the first C-17 IAF aircraft with a specialized SAR team leaving for Türkiye within hours of a request of assistance being received.

Since then, India has been able to send more than 250 personnel, specialized equipment and other relief material amounting to more than 135 tons to Türkiye on 5 C-17 IAF aircrafts.

In addition, personnel and equipment have been sent to set up a 30-bed selfsustained field hospital of the Indian Army. This includes a team of 99 specially trained personnel, essential medicines. advanced equipment, vehicles and ambulances. The hospital will provide for a fully functional Operation Theatre, facilities such as X-ray, ventilators, etc.





Life Movement

Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi wore a jacket made of material recycled from plastic bottles to the Parliament session giving a message sustainability. The Jacket was presented by the Indian Oil Corporation.In line with the Prime Minister to phase out single-use plastic, Indian Oil has adopted uniforms for retail customer attendants and LPG delivery personnel made from recycled polyester (rPET) & cotton. At the 2021 UN Climate Change Conference (UNFCCC COP26), Prime Minister Modi announced Mission Life, to bring individual behaviours at the forefront of the global climate action narrative. The Mission plans to create and nurture a global network of individuals, namely 'Pro-Planet People' (P3), who will have a shared commitment to adopt and promote environmentally friendly lifestyles.

INDIAN KITCHEN

Pukhlein

In the list of popular foods in Meghalaya, pukhlein holds a special place. This sweet treat, a prevalent dish among the Khasi tribe, has a signature character. The recipe is simple, yet the taste has a lingering effect.

Ingredients

- 1 cup rice flour
- ½ cup jaggery
- · Enough water to melt the jaggery
- Oil for deep frying

Method

- Heat a heavy-bottomed pan, and dry roast rice flour, keeping the flame low for 5 minutes
- Once it is evenly roasted, keep it aside. You can omit the preceding step if you are using handmade rice flour.
- Heat a heavy-bottomed pan and pour the water and add the jaggery
- Cook it on simmer until both ingredients dissolve and turn into a thick syrup.
- Once the syrup has thickened, gradually add the rice flour and stir until completely smooth. Ensure there are no lumps
- Turn off the gas and take the pan off the stove
- Put a damp cloth over the mixture and set it aside
- Now, preheat the oil in the deep-frying pan
- Create tiny balls from the mixture, flatten them with your palm
- Deep fry them in oil over a medium flame until both sides are golden
- To remove extra oil, place them on a kitchen towel
- With the remaining mixture, repeat the procedure.
- The delectable, crispy Pukhlein is ready to devour

Mawlynnong - Asia's Cleanest Village



Do you know that one of the cleanest villages in Asia is in India? Located in State of Meghalaya, Mawlynnong Village is knows as "God's Own Garden". Cleanliness is a way of life in Mawlynnong Village. All houses here have functional toilets since 2007. There are bamboo dustbins all over the village and plastic bags are banned. The rules are strictly followed and the defaulters are charged heavily.

That's not all, Mawlynnong gets its own manure which is converted from the garbage dug into a pit. People not only clean their houses, they step out to sweep the roads and planting trees is a part of their lifestyle too.
