

Dr. Shobhana Radhakrishna shared the talk and discussed the movement, led by Mahatma Gandhi and other prominent leaders, as a defining moment in India's quest for freedom, highlighting its role in uniting the common people and strengthening the fight against British rule.





NEWS FROM INDIA

PM Modi's Participation in the 15th BRICS Summit

Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi attended the 15th BRICS Summit in Johannesburg on August 23, 2023. He called for a strengthened BRICS, focusing on breaking barriers, revitalizing economies, inspiring innovation, creating opportunities, and shaping the future. PM also called for UNSC reforms, MFI reforms and WTO reforms. He also proposed a BRICS Space Exploration Consortium, Indian digital public infrastructure, skill mapping, and joint efforts for protecting Big Cats. PM called for AU's permanent G20 membership.



Soft Landing of Chandrayaan 3 on Moon's South Pole



India made history by becoming the first country to land on the South Pole of the lunar surface with the Vikram lander. The ISRO team initiated the Automatic Landing Sequence (ALS) 20 minutes before landing, allowing the Vikram Landing Module to identify a suitable spot and make a soft landing on the lunar surface. ISRO Chairman S Somnath thanked everyone for their support and expressed gratitude

for the success. They are looking forward to the Chandrayaan-3 lander and Rover on the lunar surface in the next 14 days. The project director, P Veeramuthuvel, praised the team's ability to soft land on the Moon and expressed the most memorable moment after four years of hard work. Mission Director M Sreekanth thanked the entire ISRO team for achieving this difficult task. The ISRO command center established a communication link between the Chandrayaan-3 Lander and MOX-ISTRAC, Bengaluru, and obtained images from the Lander Horizontal Velocity Camera during the descent.



PM's Address at Red Fort on the 77th Independence Day of India

Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi addressed the nation on 77th Independence Day from the iconic Red Fort, emphasizing India's "demography, democracy, and diversity" as key factors to achieving its dreams. He recalled the COVID-19 era and emphasized India's role as a "Vishwa Mitra" (friend of the world) during the crisis. Modi urged for a strong India to contribute to global welfare, a concept he called Vishwa Mangal (expansion). The event was attended by cabinet ministers, political leaders, service chiefs, and bureaucrats. Multi-layer security was in place across Delhi, with over 10,000 personnel manning the area.

CSIR-CMERI Scientists Develop 'Made in India Electric Tractors'

The Central Mechanical Engineering Research Institute (CMERI) in West Bengal has developed an indigenous fully electric tractor named 'CSIR Prima ET 11' for farmers. The tractor, produced in India, is designed to cater to the demand of agriculture field applications and is made more women-friendly by placing levers and switches for easy operation. The tractor can be charged using a conventional home charging socket and can be used on the field for over four hours. It features a robust and efficient transmission system using a semi-synchronized type gearing system, and is equipped with a lifting capacity of 500 kg or more. The tractor is powered by a Lithium-ion battery with Prismatic cell conformation. The CMERI has a history of designing and developing tractors of various ranges and capacities, starting with the first indigenously developed SWARAJ Tractor in 1965.

Punjab, located in India's north-western region, is a prosperous state with a vibrant population. Named after five rivers, it is a land of ethnic and religious diversity, influenced by religious movements like Sikhism, Buddhism, and Sufism. The Punjabi language, originating from the Indo-European linguistic family, is primarily agricultural. Punjab's festivals, such as Teej, Lohri, Basant, and Baisakhi, reflect its farming ethos.

How to Reach

Punjab's main airports are in Amritsar and Ludhiana, with regular flights to Delhi. Chandigarh, the capital of both Haryana and Punjab, has a domestic terminal. Punjab is easily accessible by road, with well-developed highways and people would love the 'Dhabas' that serve local food on such highways. For people who prefers going by train, trains can be taken between Amritsar and Delhi or Chandigarh and Delhi, while the rest of the nation is connected through Delhi.

Places of Interest



Popularly known as the Land of Five Rivers, Punjab is a tourist hotspot in India. Places of interest in Punjab include the capital city Chandigarh, Amritsar, Ludhiana etc. Home to the most significant Sikh pilgrimage site Golden Temple or Sri Harmandir Sahib, Amritsar is a popular cultural, spiritual and patriotic centre in the country. Ludhiana boasts of a rich history, which is evident in the prominent architectural marvels and the ancient ruins of the Lodhi dynasty like Lodhi Fort and Phillaur Fort.

Festivals

One of the best ways to ensure that tourists enjoy at least one of these celebrated events in Punjab is to plan their travel so that it falls during these festivals. While the best season to visit Punjab is in the winter, it's also a great time to attend some of these festivals. Festivals are apt occasions when Punjab erupts into colour, noise and laughter and what better way to understand and be a part of this engaging and exciting community than on their special days? Some of the famous festivals of Punjab include Baisakhi, Teeyan, Hola Mohalla, and Gurupurab, Basant Pachami etc.





Punjabi cuisine, originating from the region of Punjab, is a popular Indian cuisine with a variety of delectable vegetarian and nonvegetarian dishes, particularly the tandoori style. The region's rich cultivating lands, ideal for wheat cultivation, have made Punjabi a popular destination for gastronomy. The region's Basmati rice, sugarcane, barley, potatoes, vegetables, and fruits are grown in multicropping practices. Cattle are primarily used for agriculture and dairy farming, providing staple foods like ghee, butter, clarified butter, curd, paneer, and sweet dishes. Food additives like vinegar, starch, zarda, cumin, coriander, dried methi leaves, and black pepper are used to enhance the taste and flavor of Punjabi dishes.

Handicrafts

The traditional crafts of Punjab are remarkable for their design and intricate work. Punjab handicrafts produce some very useful items, which are exported to all over the country. The rich tradition of Punjab handicrafts includes Phulkari along with Pidhis, Jootis, Durries and Parandis. In addition, remarkable range of pottery, woodwork, metalwork etc is also being manufactured in the state.

INDIAN KITCHEN

Amritsari Kulcha

Amritsari Kulcha is crisp as well as soft leavened bread which is stuffed with boiled and mashed potatoes and spices. This bread is similar to Naan.

Amritsari Kulcha with Chole or Dal Makhani is an authentic Punjabi meal of Amritsar. It is a heavenly delight on the palate and plate.

Methods:

- Knead the dough for the Kulcha
- To prepare the dough, take a large bowl and sieve the flour in it. Add baking powder, baking soda, curd and refined oil in it. Add sugar and salt in the flour and mix it well with your fingers. Add warm milk in flour and knead the mixture to prepare a firm dough. Cover it with a damp cloth and keep it aside.
- Step 2 Prepare the potato filling
- To make the stuffing for the kulcha, take the boiled potato and mash it in a bowl. Combine finely chopped onions and green



Ingredients For Filling

- 1 boiled potato
- 1/2 onion
- 1/2 teaspoon cumin powder
- 1/4 teaspoon coriander leaves
- 1/2 green chilli
- 1/4 teaspoon red chilli powder
- 1 pinch chaat masala
- For Seasoning
- salt as required

For Dough

- 1 cup all purpose flour
- 1 table spoon olive oil
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon sugar
- 2 tablespoon yoghurt (curd)
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 2 teaspoon refined oil
- 2 tablespoon lukewarm milk

chillies with mashed potato. Add chat masala, coriander leaves, red chilli powder and cumin powder in the mixture. Sprinkle salt and mix the ingredients with a spoon.

- Step 3 Roll the Kulchas
- Now take the dough and divide it into two equal portions. Roll each portion into a ball and then flatten the ball using a rolling pin. Place a spoonful of aloo filling in the centre of the flatten dough and close the kulcha well. Sprinkle some flour over it and roll it again into a paratha.
- Step 4 Toast the Kulchas on both side
- Take a non-stick pan, add olive oil and heat it over medium flame. When oil bubbles start to rise, gently place the kulcha in the pan and cook for a minute. Flip the kulcha and cook the other side till both sides turn crispy and golden brown in colour. Once done, serve hot with Amritsari Chole.

INDIA FUN FACT

Punjab The Wheat Bowl of India

Punjab means the land of five rivers. The word has been derived from the Persian words panj (five) and aab (water). The five rivers namely Beas, Chenab, Jhelum, Ravi and Sutlej ran through pre-Independence Punjab, and are now divided between India and Pakistan. The presence of five rivers is the reason why Punjab's is conducive for wheat soil cultivation, and hence it is also called the Wheat Bowl of India.
